

Pre-registration is necessary for all classes and events. Many classes fill quickly.

Sessions will be cancelled if sufficient enrollment is not received; such fees will be fully refunded. Avoid disappointment of class cancellations, register early and invite a friend or two to register with you.

Assume you are in class and it will be held at the time and place indicated. When classes are cancelled at Spooner Area School District due to inclement weather, all day and evening ComEd classes and activities are cancelled. SACE assumes no responsibility for reaching those who do not provide a daytime email address or telephone number.

All SACE classes are self-funded; we depend on enrollment to cover the cost of instructors. If you need to cancel a registration, you must notify us at 715-635-0243, or collinsk@spooner.k12.wi.us, at least 5 business days before the class begins. *Classes*: Refunds will only be made if requested at least 5 business days ahead, minus any unrecoverable costs. No refunds will be made within 5 days of class start or after your class has started. *Trip*: No refunds will be given after the noted registration deadline unless you find someone else to take your place. If there is a waiting list for the class or trip, Community Education will help find a replacement.
