# SUMMER FOOD SERVICE PROGRAM

The Spooner Area School District will again be participating in the Summer Food Service Program, a USDA federal food assistance program. In conjunction with the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction, USDA will provide money to SASD to serve meals that meet specific nutritional guidelines. All meals will be served free of charge to any child in the district who is 18 years of age or younger, and to disabled individuals over age 18 who are enrolled in a public or private school program. There are no forms to fill out in order to qualify. EVERY child is eligible to receive meals, even if they are not a resident of the district. Children that are visiting or here on vacation are also welcome to participate.

Meals for this program will be served at Spooner Elementary School during summer school, June 17 through June 27, and August 5 through August 15, Monday through Thursday. A snack will be available from 9:00 to 9:45 a.m., with 10-15 minute time slots for Pre-K, K-2nd and 3rd grade and older. Lunch will be served from 12:15 a.m.-1:00 p.m., in the gym. We will be offering both hot and cold meals during summer school. Any child may come and receive free meals, whether they are attending summer school or not. This includes children who are not yet school age. However, ALL meals must be consumed on site. Children receiving the meals must pick them up themselves, or in the case of younger or disabled children, with the assistance of an adult. Adults accompanying children will be able to purchase meals at a cost of \$2.00 for breakfast and \$3.00 for lunch.

A snack will be available from 9:00 to 9:45 a.m., with 10-15 minute time slots for Pre-K, K-2nd and 3rd grade and older. A sack lunch will be offered at Spooner Elementary School on Fridays, June 21 and 28, and August 9 and 16 to those students enrolled in a field trip.

We encourage parents to bring or send their children to Spooner Elementary School to participate in this program. Children need good nutritious meals in the summer, just as they do during the school year.

## Registration Procedures & Fees:

Instructions for online registration are on page 22 of this booklet.

- You may return **completed registration form(s) plus fees to:**

- Only registrations **with payment** will be processed on a first-come basis.
- List first and second choices on registration form. Your choices help us determine which classes remain open. **Double check dates offered in description and on registration form.** Qualified leaders provide positive experiences. Sign up for classes per week.
- **Make payment for the class chosen with the higher cost**, refunds will be given on any additional amount(s) if your child is placed in a class with lower cost.
- Registrations will be accepted through the **May 15** deadline. After this date it is very difficult to guarantee participants will have all supplies by class dates.
- Confirmations and receipts will be sent after May 30. **Assume your child is registered in a class unless you hear otherwise.**
- Early registration is encouraged due to minimum and maximum enrollment requirements for courses to remain open.

## School Snack and Lunch:

- Offered in the elementary gym, free of charge. A snack served 9:00-9:45 a.m.; lunch served 12:15-1:00 p.m. (pre-K, 12:15; all other grades, 12:30) during summer school days. All meals must be consumed in gym.
- **Supervision provided only during meals, otherwise children must be in a class at all times.**

## Refund Policy:

- Supplies are ordered by May. Students who withdraw from programming before May 31st will receive full refund of paid registration fees. All refunds issued after June 28.
- Parents will be notified if a class needs to be cancelled, and a full refund will be made.

## Arrival and Departure Policy:

- The Elementary school gym opens at 7:45 a.m.; classrooms open at 8:00 a.m.
- **Students must be picked up no later than 10 minutes after final class.**
- In addition to parent drop off/pick up of children for summer programming, bus transport may be arranged to highly visible district pick up/drop off spots\*. Children must comply with rules as indicated in the student handbook. Transportation is a privilege, misbehavior will not be tolerated. Disruptive students will be denied transportation privileges. Routes depart at 3:00 p.m. \*See transportation section for pick up/drop off spots.
- **Drop Off and Pick Up students in the lunchroom (west gym).** Elementary students will not be allowed to wait unsupervised outside. Please remember leaders have other duties and families to attend to; respect their time commitment.

## Classes in Other School Buildings:

- Dress for the weather, students participating in classes held in middle or high schools may walk with a summer school employee after meals.
- Pick up in front lobby of middle and high school buildings after class.

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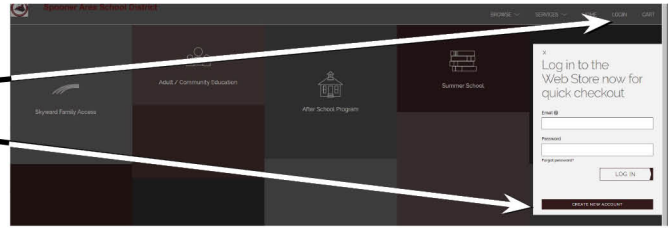

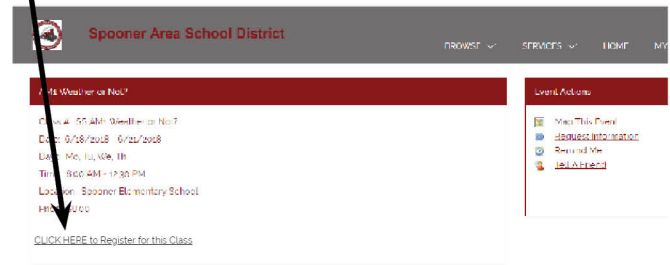
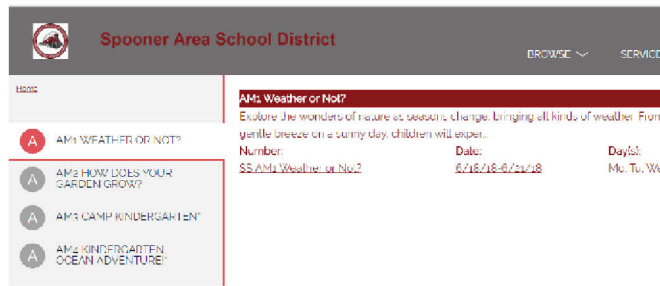
3. Click the **Summer School** button



4. Select the program category you want to register

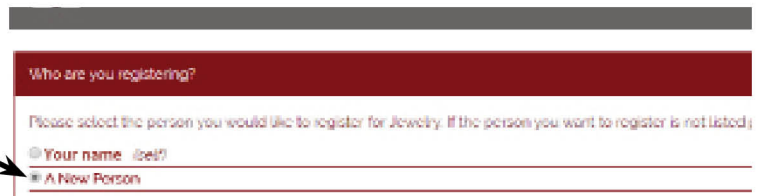


5. Select the class from the left column (gray). Select the requested **Number** or **Date** for the class you want to register. In the class window select the **Click Here to Register for this Class** link.
